The Pre-Empowered Committee reviewed the progress of the implementation of PMSGY in the State of Tripura since the previous Empowered Committee Meetings held on 8.4.2011 considered the institutional capacity of the State to efficiently execute the PMGSY works with the requisite attention to quality.

4 Physical Progress

4.1. The Pre-Empowered Committee reviewed the pace of the implementation in the State. Out of 1026 Road works sanctioned, the State has reported to have completed 851 road works. 175 works are still incomplete including 98 works, which were sanctioned prior to March 2010. The State was advised to make financial closure of all completed works on a time bound manner. The status of phase-wise year-wise completion of road works as reported by the State is given below.

- 4.2. The State representatives informed that out of 175 works pending the State has proposed to drop 8 road works and therefore the actual incomplete works would be 167. The State was advised to submit completion plan for 161 pending works immediately.
- 4.3 The State requested NRRDA that appropriate provision in the proposal module may be made in OMMAS to enable them to enter the details of bridges.
- 4.4. The State further informed that the current proposals are of full stage works and single bid for Stage-I and Stage-II will be issued.
- Some of the observations of NRRDA based on the scrutiny of two sample proposals brought by the State based are as under which should be complied before seeking the date for Empowered Committee.

51 The status of the existing roads shows in the format 2A duly certified by the STA has been sown as bituminous, which needs clarification.

5.2 Annexure 15.3 has not been enclosed in DPRs, wherein the calculation of quantities is required to be indicated.

5.3 The calculation of WBM grade 2rd seems to be higher in proportion to the quantities of the WMB grade 2rd for the cross section of the road designed.

5.4 Most of the CD works have been proposed as box culverts which leads to higher cost of construction, instead of box culvert, some other alternatives like hume pipe, slab culvert may be explored, or else State share be provided.

5.5 Certain horizontal curves are designed for a design speed of 20 km/hr whereas in exceptional cases the minimum design speed of 40 km/hr is required to be adopted as per IRC: SP 20 2002 Clause 2.4.

5.6 It is mentioned that (5.5% contractor profit and overhead 10% is considered in the rates, which is the violation of the guidelines. As per PMGSY guidelines, only (2.5% charges including contractor profit and overhead charges is allowed.

5.7 For the proposals for link route with motorized traffic less than 100 per day, carriage way width provisioned is 3.75 m. As per PMGSY guidelines for link roads with motorized traffic less than 100 per day are to be provided with 3.00 m carriage way width.

5.8. The State has not forwarded any proposal for using new technologies.

5.9. For some DPRs, vast variation in the length as per CN6 and the road length proposed observed

5.10 The provision of CD works on is or the higher side.

5.11. The maintenance cost in the current proposal is 8.150%, which is on the lower side. It should be atleast 9%.

5.12. Cost of the preparation has been reported separately and not included in the project cost.

5.13. The Sample DPRs as selected by NRRDA should be sent immediately so that the cost estimates can be verified on the basis of sufficient sample size of DPRs.

5.14. The average cost km reported is on the higher side in comparison with the proposals sanctioned in the previous phases to the State.

o Quality

- b.1 It was observed that in case of completed works, out of 163 SQM Inspections during the period April 2011 to December 2012, 22 works were graded as "Unsatisfactory" (13%), in the case on-going works, 248 SQM inspections have been carried out during the same period, out of which 79 works were graded as "Unsatisfactory" (32%). The NQM reports show that number of Unsatisfactory" works for the same period is 14% in case of completed works and 43 % in case of on-going works. The State was advised to address the issue of poor quality of roads and ensure that appropriate action is taken on all unsatisfactory works as per PMGSY guidelines.
- As required, only I ATR has been uploaded. The State was advised to take immediate action to upload remaining 52 ATRs on OMMAS.

The State was advised to prepare a comprehensive maintenance plan for maintaining the assets created under PMGSY. The Committee desired that the State Government's attention be drawn to the provision of para [7,] of PMGSY Guidelines regarding maintenance which states that "the putting in place of institutional measures to ensure systematic maintenance and providing adequate funding for maintenance of the rural Core

Network, particularly the Through Routes, will be the key to the continuance of the PMGSY

8. Absorption Capacity

programme in the State".

The financial report of the programme indicates that the expenditure incurred by the State for construction of road works under PMGSY is very low. As per the capacity assessment study (based on ongoing works, number of SQ vis. average expenditure and no. of PIUs) the State has been assessed to take up additional works of Rs. 400 crore, during the year 2013-14.

10. The State will complete following activities to fix up an early date for Empowered Committee Meeting

- 10.1. Adequate maintenance amount for the current year should be credited to SRRDA.
- 10.2. Provision of atleast 9% should be made under maintenance in the current batch of proposals.
- 10.3 Formal for MP | II and III should be provided.
- 10.4 Completion plan for all left over works should be submitted
- 10.5 A few roads should be proposed under R&D Technology in consultation with STAs
- 10.6 The balance sheet for the year 2011-2 should be prepared based on the output generated through OMMAS and should be reconciled with audited balance sheet.
- 10.7. All DPRs should be entered on OMMAS after duly vetted by STAs.
- 10.8 Sample DPRs selected by NRRDA will be provided and all the DPRs be corrected on the basis of additional observations on the sample DPRs.
- 10.9. Action should be taken to send ATRs on 52 NQM reports and upload on OMMAS.
- 10.10 Habitation data entry on OMMAS should be completed.
- 10.11 Financial closure should be made for atleas; 80% of the completed works.
- 10.12 Cost of construction should be appropriately reduced.
- The State should send a compliance report to the Ministry/ NRRDA on all issues as indicated at para 10 above while seeking date for EC meeting.
