In the light of the pre-ponement of the target for completion of PMGSY works from March 2022 to March 2019, the Committee advised the State the following:

The State has to submit balance DPRs for atleast 2000 km in respect of the balance i. unconnected habitations by January 2017. The DPRs for balance habitations would

besubmitted by February 2017;

The State representative informed that out of about 1000 habitations, which have ii. been connected incidentally under PMGSY, the details of 600 habitations have been obtained from 21 PIUs and remaining PIUs are in the process of verifying such habitations. The State would send the list of 600 such habitations and share it with NRRDA by 20th February 2017 for record. The State would reconcile balance such habitations by 31st March 2017;

The State has to prepare a realistic completion plan (month-wise and PIU-wise) in iii. respect of ongoing works, which are more than 4 years old in consultation with PIUs and a quarterly review to be held at SRRDA level in order to achieve the

desired target within the stipulated time, ie. March 2019.

#### Physical progress: 4.

4.1. The Committee reviewed the progress of works and voiced its concern regarding the large number of incomplete works particularly those roads which are more than four years old and are incomplete and emphasized the need to complete these in a time bound manner.

The State was advised to ensure that the completion plan made by the State in consultation with Central Team on 5<sup>th</sup> November 2016 is complied with.

#### 5. **DPR** Issues on the current proposal

Technical observations of NRRDA on proposals based on the scrutiny of sample DPRs are:

- Proposal has not been scrutinised at NRRDA as 37 nos of Sample DPRs received on 27.02.2017.
- Based on OMMAS data, average cost/Km of roads is on higher side when compared to 2016-17 (Batch-II) in Golaghat, Kamrup Rural and Karimganj districts.
- Average cost of 30 road works in Barpeta (2), Karimganj (27) and Tinsukia (1) districts are more than Rs. 80 Lakhs/Km. These DPRs needs to be scrutinised by the State.
- Roads with AADT less than 100, carriage way width need to be changed as 3 m (11 cases).
- State should explore the possibility to provide Cement Treated Bases and Sub bases for which the pavement design catalogue is available with IRC: SP-72-2015.
- MP1, MP2, MP3 formats and SLSC approval needs to be submitted by the State.
- 5 bridge proposals wrongly entered under ADB. Needs to be shifted under Regular PMGSY Batch – III.
- STA signed Proforma C for 95 works have not been uploaded on OMMAS.
- Images for 100 roads have not been uploaded on OMMAS. It needs to be verified and uploaded on all proposed roads.

Joint Inspection report of STA/CE/SE for bridge site as per format prescribed by NRRDA

has not been provided.

It was observed that the average cost in 3 districts particularly in Karimganj district is abnormally high while comparing the sanctions made in the current Financial Year. The State is required to re-scrutinize those DPRs before EC Meeting.

After due deliberation, the State was advised to reconsider the use of Techgrid geogrids system on account of high construction cost. The Committee also advised NRRDA to explore the possibility of procurement of cement in a bulk on a subsidized manner for construction of roads by using the technology like Cement Stabilization as being adopted by MoRTH.

#### 7. Quality

While reviewing the quality monitoring mechanism in the State, the Empowered Committee noted with concern that Quality Assurance Mechanism in the State needed substantial improvement. The Committee also observed that the first and second tier quality monitoring mechanism needs to be strengthened. Based on OMMAS data, out of 548 packages, field lab has not been established for 12 packages. During the years 2015-16 to 2016-17, out of 1303 works, 11 works have been reported with no inspection by SQMs. Further, against the target of 3405 SQM inspections, the State has conducted 878 inspections only till 27th February 2017 as per OMMAS. The State was advised to focus on the SQM inspections and liquidate the pending Inspections and should also ensure that the details in respect of balance field labs be uploaded on the OMMAS.

7.2. As regards submission of Action Taken Reports (ATR) of NQM inspections, out of 602 ATRs required during the years 2010-11 to 2016-17, ATRs on 223 works are still pending. The State was advised to liquidate all ATRs of more than 6 months' period immediately.

After due deliberations, it was decided that the State will complete following activities as agreed to by the State before the EC Meeting, which is tentatively scheduled on 20<sup>th</sup> March 2017.

- i. The State should send the list of 600 habitations, which have been incidentally connected under PMGSY/State Schemes to NRRDA;
- ii. The State would re-scrutinize the DPRs in the districts, where the average cost is high;

- The State would increase SQM Inspections substantially in the month of March, 2017 iii. and upload the reports on OMMAS;
- The State would liquidate Financial closure of works substantially. iv.
- The State should release balance State share due for the year 2016-17.
- The State should send a compliance report to the Ministry on all issues as indicated at <u>para</u> 10 above by 16th March 2017.
- The meeting ended with Vote of Thanks to the Chair. 12.
