

#### 5. DPR Issues on the current proposal

Technical observations of NRRDA on proposals based on the scrutiny of sample DPRs are:

- The average cost per Km for road works in Dhalai and South Tripura districts is on higher side when compared to previous sanctions.
- > 4 Link roads proposed without habitations under upgradation category are not eligible. Needs to be dropped.
- > Roads proposed (1 road) with less than 1.50 Km length is not eligible as per PMGSY guidelines.
- Average cost of 2 road works are more than 100 Lakhs/Km. Dhalai (1) and North Tripura (1). These DPRs needs to be scrutinised by the State.
- As the traffic volumes are of T2/T3 category, stabilization techniques which do not need aggregates should be adopted for achieving economy in construction.
- Earthwork quantities seems to be on higher side 25,000-30,000 Cum/Km. Needs to be rationalized (TR03218).
- Provision of cautionary sign boards seems to be on higher side. Needs to be rationalized.
- Dox culvert has been proposed in many roads. It needs to be verified according to site requirements and Hume Pipe Culverts may be proposed wherever suitable instead of Box culverts.
- Joint Inspection report of STA/CE/SE for bridge site as per format prescribed by NRRDA has not been provided.
- Measures for achieving economy in construction as suggested in recent report have not been adopted fully.

## 7. Quality

- 7.1. While reviewing the quality monitoring mechanism in the State, the Empowered Committee noted with concern that Quality Assurance Mechanism in the State needed substantial improvement. The Committee also observed that the first and second tier quality monitoring mechanism needs to be strengthened. During the years 2015-16 to 2016-17, out of 905 works, 17 works have been reported with no inspection by SQMs. The State was advised to focus on the SQM inspections and liquidate the pending Inspections.
- 7.2. As regards submission of Action Taken Reports (ATR) of NQM inspections, out of 629 ATRs required during the years 2010-11 to 2017-18, ATRs on 187 works are still pending. The State was advised to liquidate all ATRs of more than 6 months' period immediately.

- 1. The State should send compliance report on all technical observations of NRRDA as at Para 5 above.
- 2. The State should review the performance of CPSUs viz. NBCC and HSCL as large number of works are pending with them. A report in this regard should be sent to the Ministry.
- 3. The State should quickly award all the works sanctioned in 2016-17 and upload the details on OMMAS.
- 10. The State should send a compliance report to the Ministry on all issues as indicated at <u>para 9</u> above within two weeks.
