2. Current Proposal by the State:

Out of 36 roads proposed, 17 roads (37.82 km) is 3.0 m wide with average cost of Rs 80.46 lakh/km and 19 roads (416.05 km) is 3.75 m wide with average cost of Rs 92.81 lakh/km. 144.71 km is of earthen surface and 162.24 km is of Gravel. All proposal of 36 roads and 75 bridges have been scrutinized by STA.

3. DPR observations

- i. State has reduced average cost/Km from Rs. 139.44 Lakhs to Rs. 91.79 Lakhs/Km.
- ii. State has provided Rs. 7.36 Lakhs/Km for higher specification cost from the State funds.

iii. Joint Inspection report of Bridge site needs to be provided by the state.

4. Maintenance

Committee agreed to the State's proposal of Rs. 2,915.54 lakh (7% of the construction cost) for 5 years routine maintenance cost and Rs. 8,769.78 lakh (21.05% of the construction cost) for the 6th year's renewal coating.

5. R & D Proposals

State has proposed 129.51 km (28.54% of length) using waste plastic under Main Streaming Technology and 21.89 km (4.82% length) using soil stabilizer under IRC Accredited Materials/Technologies as per New Technology Initiative guidelines. State was advised to obtain soil stabilizer of prescribed quality from open market.

6. Progress of PMGSY works

State has achieved 17.4 km against the target of 165.81 km under Phase I of RCPLWEA. State has assured to complete the balance length of RCPLWEA by May 2020. It was also observed that there is inconsistency in the state data and the OMMAS data and state was advised to rectify the discrepancy and update the OMMAS as per actual progress. Chairman directed that all old works with zero expenditure may be quickly proposed for dropping by the State. State should also share road wise milestones with timelines in respect of sanctioned projects under Phase I and achievement thereof with the Ministry so that progress could be monitored. Details of progress of the state as per OMMAS are as under:

7. e-Marg:

Progress of the State (PWD {RCPLWEA}) on e-Marg is not satisfactory and it was advised to take up the matter separately with the state and transition of the PWD (RCPLWEA) on e-Marg should be expedited.

8. Quality:

Out of 12 packages, lab has not been established for 1 package which should be done at the earliest.

9. Finance Issues:

Committee observed that GoI (central share) had released Rs 57.04 crore to the State in February 2018, however the fund was received by SRRDA in May, 2019 which needs to be scrutinized. State share of Rs. 38.03 crore has been booked under central fund which also needs to be corrected.

10. Recommendations of Empowered Committee

Empowered Committee recommended the above proposal at Para 2 above subject to addressing the issues brought out as above, during implementation.

11. The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.
